

Places to Donate Used Books



For some, the hardest item to declutter is books. But one of the most common questions is, "Where can I donate my used books?"

It's an interesting paradox when you think about it. But the struggle and the question are probably related. Books are an important part of our lives. When we decide it's time to part with them, we want to know they are going to a nice home where they can continue to enrich and improve other people's lives.

In order to provide a thoughtful and thorough answer to the question above, I've spent time researching the most current and up-to-date places to donate your lightly-used books.

Here's a list of 10 places to donate used books:

FQDI The mission of the Fondation québecoise de la déficience intellectuelle is to collect funds to support organizations that work to integrate and improve the quality of life for people with an intellectual disability. They have many collection boxes around the city but will also provide home pick-up.

- Atwater Library and Computer Center They welcome book and DVD donations, which make their way into their library collection or help them raise funds through their Book Sale Room. Please note that they cannot accept encyclopedias, textbooks, out-of-date computer books or National Geographic because they have no market for them. Please bring donations to the 4023 Tupper Street entrance which is close to the Book Sale Room.
- Renaissance The mission to integrate people into the workforce is at the heart of the activities at Renaissance. There are many drop off bins around the city including one near the fire station in Ste Anne's, also at 42B St. Charles in Beaconsfield and there is a donation centre in Ile Perrot.
- Diabetes Quebec Foundation Diabetes Québec has made it its mission to defend the rights of diabetics, providing them and their loved ones with information and services. Diabetes Québec also fosters the training of health-care professionals, raises public awareness of diabetes, and subsidizes research. Home pick-ups are available at your door to make things easier. - ➤ <u>Habitat for Humanity</u> Donate to the ReStore. Donations are gratefully accepted from individuals and businesses in the community. - ➤ <u>Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation</u> Dedicated to helping children and youths who are faced with personal or socioeconomic difficulties, as well as their families.
